The Rector writes.....

I write this following the restarting of the growth groups; it was wonderful to come together, to read, pray and encourage one another. Last Sunday, I watched as our children ran around the hall playing. On Wednesday, the Together at Ten congregation came together for communion and continued chatting over coffee afterwards. These experiences got me thinking about two questions: what makes our Church family special, and secondly, how is Church culture formed? The answer to both of those questions is the same: the people.

The Church is directed and formed by its 'family' - the people who make it such a vibrant community, embracing all generations, and encouraging one another to walk with God. And I see this at Together at Ten, at Morning Call, and in the growth group meeting.

Our Church charter is set out in Hebrews 10:14-15: "...let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another - and all the more as you see the Day approaching...".

As a Church family, we are expected to be a community which supports and encourages one another, urging those in it to grow in their relationship with God and to be more like Jesus Christ. This requires us all to play a part in the family. We need to use our abilities and talents to this end.

Our Church is formed and shaped by the behaviour of its members; if we want our church to grow, it falls to all of us to nurture the growth, to encourage others and to be servants to all. Mahatma Gandhi once said "...be the change you hope to see..." and claimed "...we but mirror the world. All the tendencies present in the outer world are to be found in the world of our body. If we could change ourselves, the tendencies in the world would also change. As a man changes his own nature, so does the attitude of the world change towards him...". In other words, make the change you want to see.

Our Church is special because the people in it make it special, and I pray that more people will find their place and encourage others to grow to be more like Jesus.


We recently had Francis from the 'Fearless' project come and talk about 'Summer Madness' which we hope some of us will be able to attend once again in July.

On Advent Sunday, the Rector signed the Church Pledge in support of the Mothers' Union RISE UP Against Domestic Abuse challenge. Our commitment to advertising helplines and support services for those suffering abuse and our support for Women's Aid meant that St Patrick's was awarded the Bronze Award of the challenge. We are the first church in Ireland to achieve this – something of which we should all be proud. We hope to continue responding to the challenge and to achieve the Silver Award in due course.



Extract from Belfast Cathedral 120 - Chairs Appeal

"...On Sunday 2nd June 2024 St Anne's Cathedral Belfast will mark the 120th Anniversary of the Consecration of the Nave of the cathedral on 2nd June 1904. We have launched our Cathedral 120 Chairs Appeal to replace the old wooden chairs of the Nave with 500 quality comfortable, moveable and stackable new chairs. I am therefore writing to ask if you would donate a chair. The cost per chair is £150 (or for a personal donation by an individual £120 & Gift Aid). The names of all to be remembered through the gift of a chair will be recorded together in a memorial plaque placed in the nave of the cathedral...".

The Select Vestry agreed to pay for three chairs.

expeditions in the Dordogne in France in July have attended three district training nights in preparation. Bronze DofE certificates were presented to four Explorers




this term, making five in total for this year. Well done all.
